Dear Parents/Guardians.

Welcome to Holy Innocents School. My name is Ms. Traci Tudor and I am the Kindergarten teacher. Miss Daniella Matamoros is my teaching assistant. Uniforms can now be purchased through Flynn and O'Hara locations – 10905 Dutton Rd. (215-637-4600) and 6801 Frankford Ave. (215-624-1983) We have enclosed a flyer with information on how to purchase your child's uniform. The gym uniform is the regulation uniform for students in Pre-K and Kindergarten. There are 2 options, spring, (April 15th – October 31st) and winter.

Navy blue shorts

Navy blue sweatpants

Blue golf shirt (Since colored shirts are not permitted to be worn under short sleeve golf shirts, a long sleeve golf shirt is recommended for the winter time.)

Navy blue sweatshirt

Gray T-shirt for gym day ALL UNIFORM ITEMS MUST HAVE THE SCHOOL LOGO

Non-marking sole sneakers (MUST HAVE VELCRO STRAPS unless your child knows how to tie shoes.) NO LIGHT UP SNEAKERS PERMITTED

The children are expected to wear their uniform on the first day.

The following is a stationery list of supplies that can be purchased before school begins.

1 – Standard size school bag (no wheels, please)

Clear contact paper (to keep at home, to cover books and folders)

LOTS of glue sticks. This year parents purchased around 24 glue sticks and sent them to school in a plastic bag with the child's name. The glue lasted for most of the year. Target and Wal-Mart usually have great sales in July and August on glue sticks. We use glue almost everyday so please stock up. We only use glue sticks, please do not purchase liquid glue for school. Be careful, in the past I found that glue sticks from the dollar store are dried out and do not work. All other supplies will be purchased through the school. I will supply the stationery. The cost will be \$65.00. That includes a fee for art, computer, MSP, a seat sack that your child will keep, and all other supplies.

Kindergarten children do have homework every night and will need pencils, crayons, glue, and scissors at home. We will have a Parent Orientation Day by appointment on Wednesday, September 6th. You and your child must come to school to familiarize your child with the new classroom and meet the teachers. IMPORTANT information will be shared. I am looking forward to working with you. Listed below are some activities you can do over the summer:

- 1) Practice making the Sign of the Cross.
- 2) Alphabet recognition print upper and lower case letter on index cards, shuffle and use as flash cards. Have your child name each letter. After he/she has mastered each letter name, practice speed. (Naming all letters as fast as possible)
- 3) Practice sounds of each letter by asking what sound a word begins with (rain r).
- 4) Practice printing his/her name.
- 5) Learn address, phone number, and birthday.
- 6) READ to your child everyday.
- 7) Teach one phone or cell number where you can be reached.
- 8) Practice tying shoes.
- 9) Practice the route home with your child. Walk your child from the school to the corner where someone will meet him/her. Instruct your child not to cross any street. Stay with the teacher until the person walking him/her home takes his/her hand.
- 10) Mandatory summer book report due on or before September 11, 2023. (ALL ABOUT ME BOOK)

We ask each family to donate the following products to be used by the children throughout the year. Please put your child's name on each item and send in as soon as possible.


<u>Page 3: My Friends:</u> On this page your child will draw a picture or paste a photo of him/herself with some friends. Then they will write the names of these friends.




<u>Page 5: Use your imagination:</u> This page is where your child will get creative and share something else he/she wants us all to know about them!



Lines are walked to the corner by different teachers, for the safety of everyone we ask you not to take your child out of line until they reach the designated corner. Car rider cars are to form lines in the school yard and directed out of the yard when all classes are dismissed. We ask parents to get out of the car and take your child by the hand to your car. Again, this is for the safety of everyone and time spent waiting is minimal.
